PRIOR TO HEARING

JUVENILE STATEMENTS

SEC. 51.095 TEXAS FAMILY CODE

"The Family Code offers slightly more Protection for juveniles than the CCP [Code of Criminal Procedure] and indicates that statements made by juveniles are admissible if they are made in writing after a magistrate is satisfied that the child understands his or her rights, if statements are made orally regarding circumstances that are found to be true, if the statement was res gestae of the delinquent conduct, if the statement is made in open court or before a grand jury, or if the statement is made orally and electronically recorded while the suspect is in custody. The Family Code, like the CCP, however does not require that complete interrogations be recorded."


And at a transfer hearing, "the court may consider written reports from probation officers, professional court employees, Professional consultants, or employees of the [TJD], in addition to the testimony of witnesses." Id. § 54.11

The transfer hearing is a "second chance hearing" after a child, such as J.M.S.M., has already been sentenced to a determinate number of years.	
It is not part of the guilt/innocence determination and need not meet the extensive due process requirements of an actual trial. Id.	
it is dispositional rather than adjudicative in nature	

the legislature has determined that such evidence may be considered in transfer hearings




